The Ravine House Pool dam will be under construction, beginning this summer. It is expected that the work will be completed by Sept. 15. The repairs to the bridge will be 75 percent financed by FEMA. HEB Engineering has been contracted to coordinate & oversee the project. The design has been prepared by FEMA. Bidding on the project will close at 1 p.m. on July 19, with project expected to begin on July 26. Access to Durand Lake and the community recreation area will be via the Beeline Path—NOT over the pool dam.
