The Ravine House Pool dam will be under construction & closed this summer. Bids for the work were opened on July 19. The low bidder was Gordon T. Burke & Sons, Inc. of N. Conway. The bid was \$119,784. However, FEMA has not indicated when the work will begin. It is expected that the work will be completed by Sept. 15. Access to Durand Lake & the community recreation area will be via the Beeline Path—NOT over the pool dam.
