### **July Programs:**

- **July 9 & 10** at 2:00 p.m. The Randolph Library, Music in the Great North Woods and the NH Chapter of the American Guild of Organists will be sponsoring a STEAM Project called "Color Our World with MUSIC". There will be an organ building kit called Orgelkids Kit, for young and old alike. It will arrive at the Randolph Town Hall for two sessions: Wednesday July 9<sup>th</sup> at 2:00 pm will include building and playing an organ, and the second session will be on Thursday July 10<sup>th</sup> which will involve playing and taking it apart. Participants can attend either session, or both. We are excited to be able to create this special project, which includes science and music.
- **July 16<sup>th</sup>** at 7:00 - The RPL and the Randolph Conservation Commission are collaborating to host a presentation on Microplastics. Jill Emerson, Staff Scientist from the Green Mountain Conservation Group in Ossipee, NH. will be presenting virtually on the large screen in the Town Hall via zoom. The Randolph Conservation commission will pay the \$100 speaker's fee.
- **July 23<sup>rd</sup>** at 11:00 a.m. The PLAYAH Theatre Group will present "Sugar-Coated Shakespeare", sponsored by the Friends Group. The location is still to be determined. Possibly at the Ravine House Pool Site, or at the Town Hall if the weather is bad.
- **July 26<sup>th</sup>** - The Annual Book and Bake Sale. Book Sale set up July 25<sup>th</sup>, 4:00pm at the Town Hall.

- Press releases are being sent weekly for all our upcoming programs.
- The sunshade is up. Thank you to Larry Jenkins, Annie Colella and Jon Gilson for helping to put it up.
